

Thailand's intervention on Stockpile Management BMS5, 16 June 2014, morning session

Thank you Mr. Chair for giving me the floor,

First of all, my delegation would like to express our appreciation to you and your team for the hard work and for the draft which has been a good basis for our discussion.

My delegation would like to share our views on the first section of Stockpile Management as follows

Thailand appreciates and supports the proposal made by many countries during informal and today's meetings to enhance Physical Security Measures and Stockpile Management.

Thailand fully supports the inclusion of the role of women and civil society in effective implementation of the PoA and ITI. Thailand also stands ready to play an active role in this respects.

We recognize and welcome the roles **that** technology and the advancement of technology play in this issue. We also believe that, to effectively implement the PoA, the sharing and transfer of technology as well as capacity building is vital, especially to developing countries.

At both regional and international levels, we attach importance to information exchange and intelligence sharing to the enhancement of Physical Security Measures and Stockpile Management.

Lastly, we see the possible constructive role of the UN Peacekeeping Missions. However, my delegation views that the change of or additional mandates of the UN peacekeeping operation should be discussed and endorsed by the Security Council with close consultations with the TCCs and PCCs. It maybe premature to include this issue in several Paras, 3 4 15 44 and 45, of the outcome document of the BMS5. We urge relevant UN bodies to discuss this issue within proper mechanism and forum so that we will have a clearer direction on how to proceed this issue effectively
